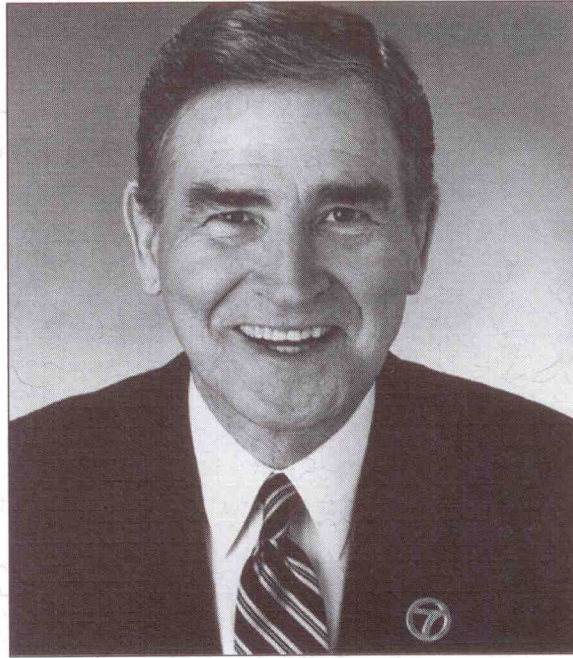


John Drury



John Drury has been a Chicago News anchor for 5 and 10 P.M. newscasts for WLS-TV since 1984. A working journalist, his primary focus has been on investigative reporting. His career began in 1955 at WTMJ-TV in Milwaukee. From 1962 to 1967, John was Fahey Flynn's first co-anchor at WBBM-TV. In 1967, he joined WGN-TV as anchor of its 10 P.M. News. At WLS-TV, from 1970-1979, his credible approach to local news reporting won him many awards. Once again, John joined WGN-TV, from 1979-1984, for its *9 O'Clock News*. In 1989, he received the Better Government Association's Distinguished Journalism award. A recipient of several Chicago Emmy Awards, for spot news coverage, best documentary and best feature, he is a newly elected member of the Chicago Journalism Hall of Fame.
